Geography

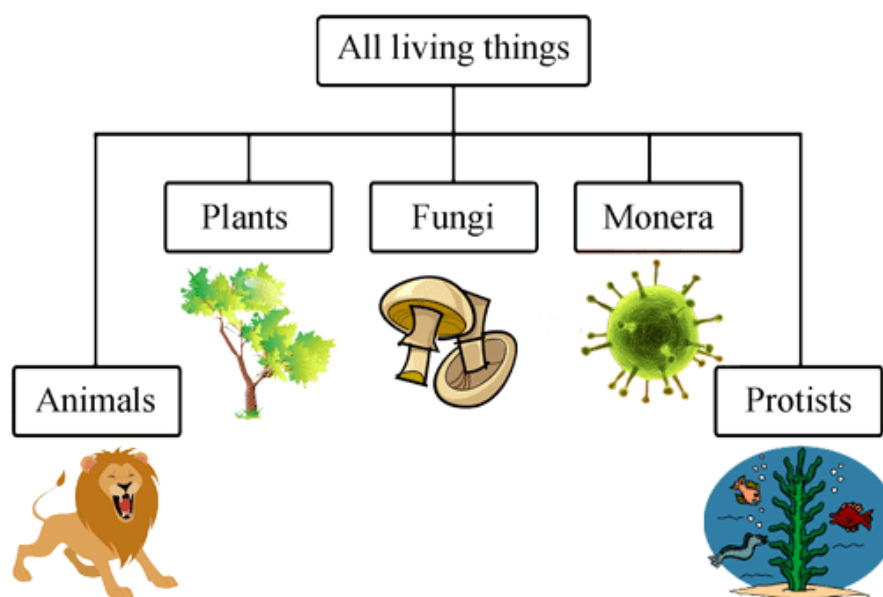


We shall be naming and locating the seven continents and five oceans of the world. We shall also be locating some of the major seas of the world and finding out the difference between an ocean and a sea. We will be investigating similarities and differences between the continents.



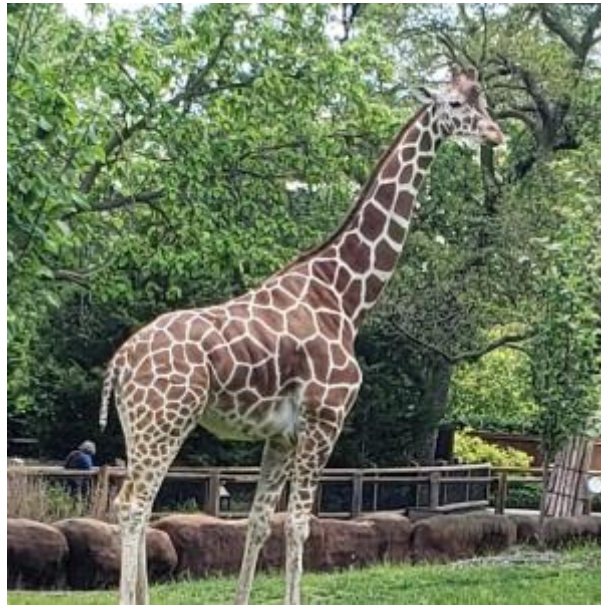


Science



We shall be will be looking at world habitats and how animals live in habitats to which they are suited and how different habitats provide the basic needs for the animals that live there.

We shall also be visiting the Yorkshire Wildlife Park to see for ourselves the needs of different animals.





Computing



We will be learning to create algorithms and programs. We shall then find and fix any errors in the program. This is known as debugging. To do this we shall be working with Beebots and floor robots.



Music



We will be listening to the Carnival of the Animals by Camille Saint-Saens to identify different instruments.

We shall also listen to music from around the world and use instruments to create music in the style that we hear from different parts of the world.





P.E.



The children will be focusing on games and athletic skills. We shall pay particular attention to throwing and catching skills, developing both underarm and overarm throwing. We shall practise throwing a ball into the air and clapping before catching it, developing our hand and eye co-ordination.





R.E.



In R.E. we shall be developing our knowledge and understanding of another faith. We shall be focusing on Judaism.

We shall be discussing safety and how to stay safe in the water.

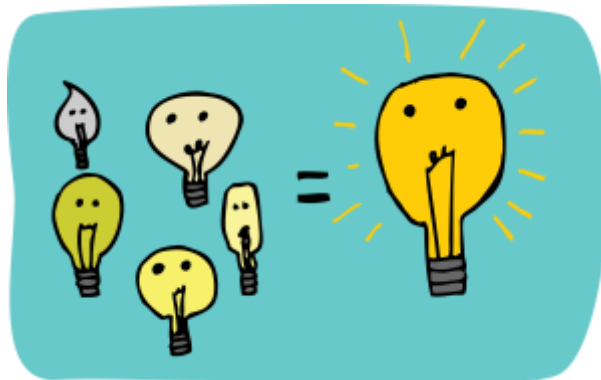
We shall also discuss what it is like to be part of a group how it feels to be left out.

Homework



Children always have reading as part of their homework and are expected to read at home regularly. In mathematics the children need to practise the number bonds to and within 10, initially and then use these to calculate number bonds to and within 20 and then to 100; as well as practising their 2's, 5's and 10 times tables. The children have their log in and password for 'TTRockstars' so that they can practise their times tables at home. Spellings for the half term will be uploaded on to Teams, dated for each week, rather than sending spellings home each week.
